GOOD CAUSE APPEARING THEREFORE, and in accordance with the authority granted the presiding judge under California Rules Of Court, Rule 10.603,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, commencing August 5, 2022, Local Rule 9.12(a)(ii) Court Reporter Availability in Criminal Actions, is hereby modified to read as follows:

Pursuant to Government Code Section 69957, when a court reporter is not available, the Court, subject to the availability of approved equipment and equipment monitors, may use and provide electronic recording of misdemeanor court trials and jury trials, misdemeanor pretrial motions and motions in limine, misdemeanor out-of-custody arraignments, misdemeanor jury trial readiness, misdemeanor pretrial conferences, and misdemeanor domestic violence pretrial conferences.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order shall remain in effect until such time as it is rescinded, superseded or otherwise modified by the Presiding Judge of the San Mateo County Superior Court.
